I've been collecting comics four for decades (that's only three years in superhero years!) and while I've had my favorite artists and writers, it's pretty rare to find a creative team that bends my brain so well. Alan Moore, John Totleben and Stephen Bissette on Swamp Thing, Greg Rucka and J. H. Williams III on Batwoman. and Elsa Charlotte English Kroese's wonderful fantasy webcomic, Spindrift.

And now, Marjorie Liu and Sana Takeda. Taken by themselves, the writing and art are superb; together, they are spectacular. I cannot throw enough rose petals at your feet. A friend recently asked me to recommend comic panels fine enough to frame; I pointed him at MONSTRESS and said, "Take your pick." Issue #3 is particularly strong in this regard, cover to cover. The scenes with Yvette and the Inquisitrix are riveting, as is Maika's dream in the Egyptian-style tomb. The line art, the inking, the colors... wow.

But as beautiful as the art is (and it is beautiful), the writing is sharp and engaging, too. I like that you

take risks in your plot; in this book, violence toward the innocent is portrayed as ordinary and mundane, giving the reader a gut-punch without feeling exploitative or pandering. It plays out like the real world, with real-world stakes and consequences. I love it. I absolutely love it. (And I especially love wee Kippa, the living chibi fox girl.)

This letter has run far too long, but it's your fault for making the book so damn good.


