**Hi Ryan! Thank you so much for the kind words. And that's a great question! I can't remember a time when I haven't been surrounded by books, and I'm sure all of them have had some influence – epic fantasy novels, mysteries and thrillers, the gothic. But poets are my first and best literary mentors – there is nothing more powerful than a poem, nothing that satisfies quite as much, or moves as deeply through me. My favorite poets, the poets I keep close at hand (for now, because there's a rotation) are: Jorge Luis Borges, Pablo Neruda, Lu Xun, Staceyann Chin, Li-Young Lee, Ruth Forman, Rainer Maria Rilke, and Lauren Alleyne.**

While it's nice to see growing Asian representation in media, it's even better if it comes from Asian creators. I'd like to thank you for sharing this story with us, and I want you to know that you have my support! I grew up

My only little criticism is that I was hoping for a stronger Asian ("an alternate 1900s Asia") ambience. Words like "Constantine", "Cumae" – these all hearken to Roman and European influence.

But, that being said, Marjorie is writing in the style of modern fantasy. I mean, look at *Attack on Titan* – it is Japanese but set in Germany-looking world. In any event, the name stuff doesn't matter, and I enjoy the complexity and depth of the plot.

**Regarding your hopes for a stronger Asia: It's important to understand the breadth of what was, and is, considered to be "*the Orient*" – a historical term used by scholars to describe a geographical and cultural landscape that encompassed not just what we think of as modern Asia, but the Middle East, parts of Eastern Europe, and for some countries, Northern Africa.**

**Asia, in that context, has long been a hybrid space, filled with endless cultural complexity and influences. Those influences, however, could be felt even more strongly in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries; by the early 1900s, all major Chinese cities had foreign enclaves and a culture that was shot through with western colonial definitions of the modern – arguably oppressive, and practiced down to a cruel art (as could be attested in other parts of Asia, particularly India and Vietnam). My own experiences in China form the blood and bone of MONSTRESS, and as a writer I was less interested in dreams of Asian purity than in exploring the mixed hybridic Asia I know so well – and that I'm part of in very personal ways.**
